GENERAL ELECTION THURSDAY 8th JUNE Does the Church tell me whom I should vote for?

No. The Church does not tell us whom to vote for when we enter the voting booth. It does not endorse an official list of candidates or tell us which party Catholics should join. Instead, Catholics are to use their judgment and follow their consciences as they apply the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ and the core faith values to the choices they make in the voting booth. As Catholics, following the challenging path of discipleship, we need to evaluate the issues and candidates in the light of our Catholic faith. Then, we are challenged to live out our faith by getting actively involved – by voting and engaging in other civic activities. Four key principles of Catholic social doctrine are key to making practical judgments to do good and avoid evil in voting: 1. Promoting and defending the dignity of the human person; 2. Supporting the family and subsidiarity in local and national institutions; 3. Working for the common good where human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met; 4. Acting in solidarity with concern for all as our brothers and sisters, especially the poor and most vulnerable.

JUNE IS THE MONTH WHEN WE CONTEMPLATE THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS. There are several hymns to the Sacred Heart in our Hymnbook, all of which are fine prayers in their own right. They are: All ye who seek a comfort sure; O Sacred Heart, our home lies deep in Thee; Sweet Heart of Jesus, fount of love and mercy; To Christ the Prince of Peace; To Jesus' Heart all burning.

MEDITATION FOR PENTECOST 4th JUNE: ON THE HOLY SPIRIT WITHIN US. We shall in our measure be comforter after the image of the Holy Paraclete, and that in all senses of the word – advocates, assistants, soothing aides. Our words and advice, our very manner, voice and look will be gentle and tranquillizing, as of those who have borne their cross after Jesus Christ. We shall not pass by His little ones rudely, as the world does. The voice of the widow and orphan, the poor and the destitute, will at once reach our ears, however low they speak. Our hearts will open towards them, our word and deed will befriend them. (*Blessed John Henry Newman*)

BEING APPROPRIATELY DRESSED IN CHURCH As summer arrives, we should remember to be appropriately dressed when we come to Mass. The Church does not stipulate a specific manner of being dressed in the sense of wearing one's "Sunday best". However, we are all expected to be dressed in a manner that can be described as modest and respectful. To put it simply, we should not be dressed as if we are going to the beach: shoulders should be covered, no exposed midriffs. For men: this means that a short-sleeved shirt or a T-shirt is acceptable, but not a vest-type top which leaves shoulders exposed; trousers or – three-quarter lengths are acceptable, but not shorts which expose the knee. Similar standards are expected for women. This is a matter of respect and reverence both before the Lord, and so that we are not a distraction to other worshippers. Readers and EMHCs should be careful to avoid wearing clothing which can be distracting, such as tops which have obtrusive non-religious wording or advertising of a particular brand, or any image which might be distracting.
